Center open for 2015! Opened for season on May 2nd

We are open from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. 7 days a week.

Although the Center had been closed for the winter, our wonderful volunteers still checked messages 12 hours a day, 7 days a week from September through April. We have already had over 175 wildlife intakes since January 1st.

One intake a week before opening was a baby killdeer (pictured). Killdeer, classed as "[precocial](#)", hatch out ready to roll, in that they are able to walk and eat on their own immediately. They rely on their parents only for protection. This young killdeer was found by a woman on a walk, who mistakenly thought it had been abandoned and brought it to us. It was healthy and peeping loudly (calling for its parents). Our Center Coordinator encouraged the finder to return it to where it was found. Read more about killdeer [here](#)
